<u>Clean Boats – Clean</u> <u>Waters</u>

The Clean Boats Clean Water program (CBCW) is back in place. Look for Paul and Dave when entering or leaving the Public Boat Landing. This year the PLPRD has received a \$4,000 state grant to help cover expenses. The Forest County Services has also agreed to let the District put the Lake Association dock back this year. Cold Paks from the DNR are offered to fisherman for keeping their fish cool.

Saturday, May 24th, was the first "good weather" weekend for fishing. On that day, 125 boats were in and out of the Pine Lake Landing.

On May 23rd the DNR increased the daily bag limit of walleye on Pine Lake from 2 to 3.

It was agreed at the recent Quarterly meeting to proceed with completing Tasks 2 through 8 to provide a report of the Final Feasibility Study by August 31, 2014. This is designed to help the District decide whether or not to continue to the next phase. Grafelman will make a presentation and progress report at the PRPRD Annual Meeting on July 5, 2014. It is important for all District members to attend and participate in the discussion for a final decision.

Pine Lake Water Quality Results for 2013

The final results of water quality monitoring for 2013 are complete and summarized below.

2013

From late May to late September water clarity was sampled 14 times, ranging from 2.25 to 6.25 feet. The best reading was early June at 6.25 feet and the worst was mid July/mid August at 2.25 feet. The average summer (July-Aug) secchi disk reading was 2.6 feet, more than a foot worse than last year. Water clarity was ok in late May and early June, but declined significantly in late June and never recovered. Ice out was May 3rd versus March 22nd last year.

Phosphorus was sampled in April, June, July and August and Chlorophyll was sampled in June, July and August. Phosphorus readings were 33, 30, 39 and 48 PPB (parts per billion) respectively. All the samples were much higher than last year. According to the WIDNR, lakes with readings above 30 may experience noticeable algae blooms. The corresponding Chlorophyll readings were 17, 34, and 41 PPB with the threshold for Chlorophyll at 20. Again, these samples were also significantly higher than last year.

2013 vs 2012.....

The 2013 summer average (July-Aug) secchi reading declined to 2.64 feet compared to 3.92 feet in 2012. The 2013 summer average (July-Aug) for Phosphorus increased to 43.4 PPB compared to 36 in 2012.

The 2013 summer average (July-Aug) for Chlorophyll increased to 37.5 PPB compared to 20.3 in 2012.

2014

This year we begin the 14th consecutive year of monitoring water quality on Pine Lake. Due to the late ice out again, sampling is off to a late start. See below for water clarity data thru 2013......

Ecoli Testing

Member Jerry Wolf has been keeping track of the Ecoli testing done by the US Forest Service at the Federal campgrounds beach. To date none of the samples were high enough to cause a beach closing report; however, the increases since 2005 coincide with the CLMN Chemical testing results showing a corresponding increase in Phosphorous and Chlorophyll. Below are the results of the May 15, 2014 tests.
