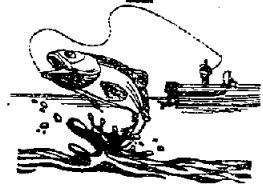

Due to the fact that the DNR and the town have been leaving the dam wide open the last couple of years, we have had problems getting our weed harvesting equipment into shore to unload the weeds on the conveyer. In order to alleviate this, we would like to have a permit to dredge out the above mentioned area by the conveyor so we can get our weed harvesting equipment into the shore.

We would like to try it this year and if it works, we will renew the permit again in 2005. I have been told that this hole will fill itself in again, due to water movement.

Please let me know if there is anything else I need for the permit.

The expedited permit review guarantees a decision within 90 days for most activities, 150 days for activities requiring a public notice or environmental assessment (EA), or 210 days for activities requiring both public notice and EA. If you wish to request an expedited permit review, submit a letter with your application describing the time frame that will meet your needs, along with a check for the applicable permit fee and a separate check for the supplemental \$2000 fee. (The supplemental fee funds permit reviewers specifically designated for expedited decision-making). Within twenty days we will respond in writing, specifying any additional information needed for an expedited decision on your proposal, and the date by which we can make a decision once the application is complete.

Refunds of standard fees are made only if the refund is requested before we determine that the application is complete. Supplemental fees will be refunded if a decision is not made by the agreed-upon date.

After-the-fact applications, for permits or approvals submitted after work has been commenced or completed, require twice the usual fee. Projects started or completed without obtaining the appropriate permits are subject to potential enforcement actions (e.g. monetary forfeitures or mandatory abatement).

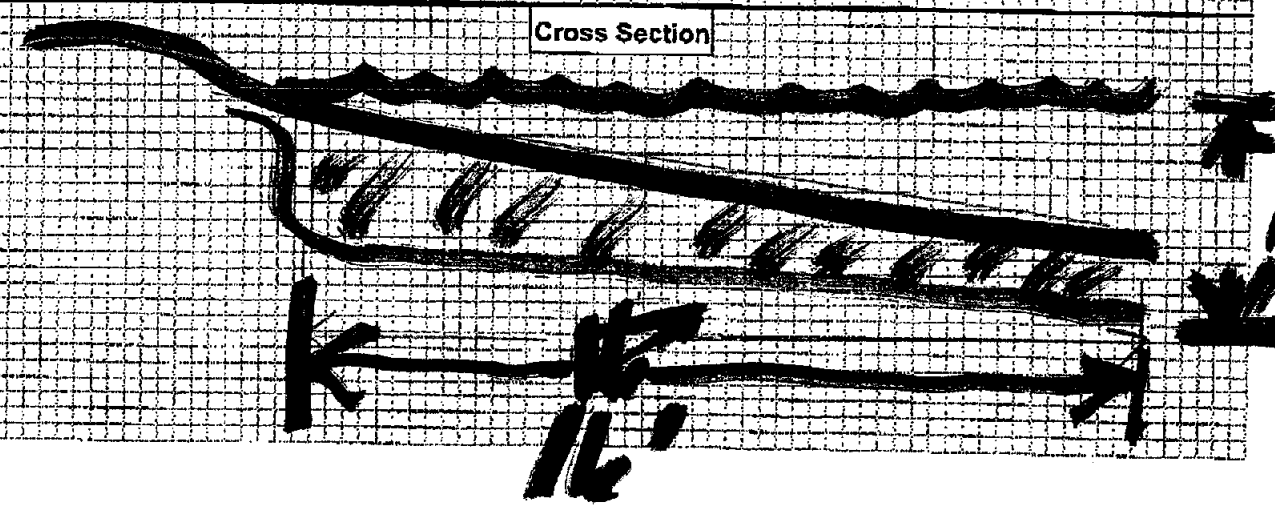
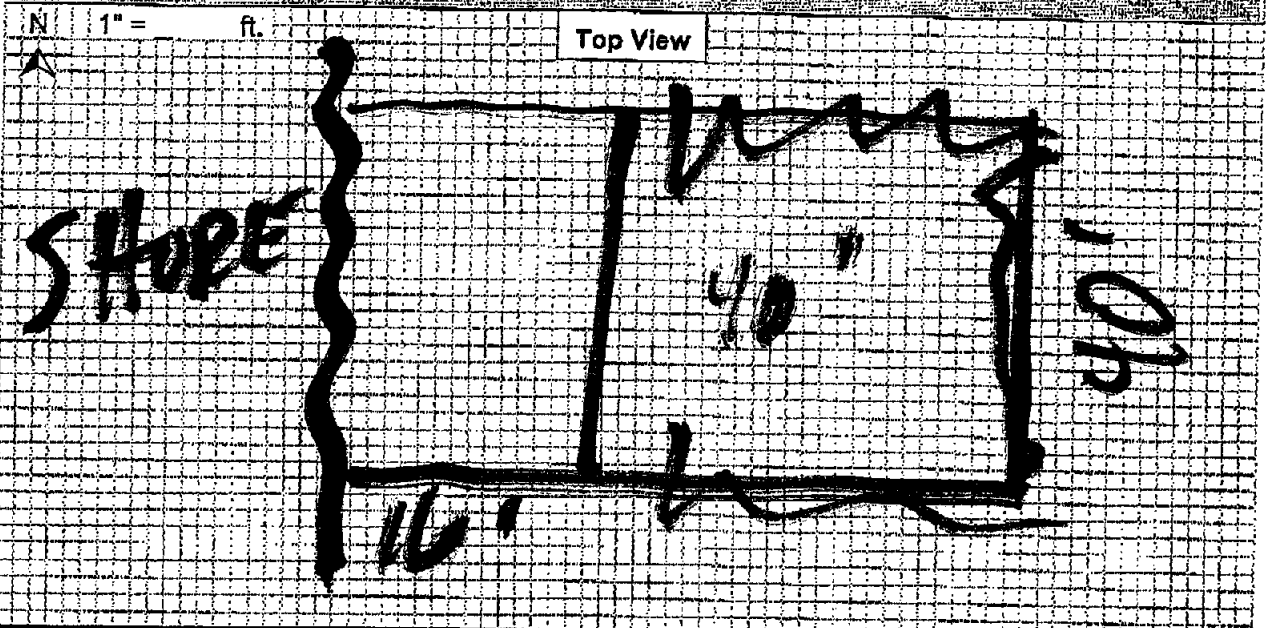

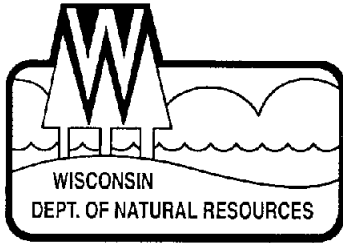

Dear Mr. Tauer:

This acknowledges receipt of your DNR permit application for a permit to remove materials from the bed of Pine Lake in Forest County. This letter contains important information regarding your permit application, so please read it carefully.

In accordance with state law, this letter is notification that your permit application is incomplete, and that you must submit additional information. The additional information is necessary for Department staff to determine if your proposed project will meet the standards specified in state statutes and administrative rules.

In particular:

- Purpose and Need – The letter accompanying the application indicates a problem with operation of the dam, owned by the Town of Hiles, as a primary reason for needing to dredge the site of the weed harvester. Please supply records of dam operation and water level elevations.
- Location and Plans
 - You must show the Township, range and quarter/quarter section of the project.
 - Please include a map showing the exact location of the project.
 - Please include a detailed sketch of the proposed project showing all dimensions. This should include:
 - A top view and a cross section view.
 - Dimensions of length, width and depth of proposed dredging
 - Elevations of water level
 - Present lake bottom elevations of the site before dredging
 - Proposed lake bottom elevation of the site after dredging
- Means of Dredging – Please indicate if you plan to dredge the site by mechanical or hydraulic methods.
- Please indicate the proposed means of controlling sedimentation and erosion during the dredging process. This should also be shown on your project sketch.
- Please calculate the amount of material you plan to dredge from the site.
- Sediment Analysis is needed to determine how to dispose of the spoils. This should be a one-time grab sample of the sediment and include the following analyses:
 - Total Copper
 - Total Arsenic

- Dredge disposal site – Please show the location and dimensions of your proposed spoils disposal area. This should include:
 - Distance from surface waters and wetlands (dredge spoils cannot be deposited in wetlands)
 - Length, width and expected depth of dredge spoils
 - Carriage water containment measures
 - Erosion control

Please include five (5) copies of your completed application.

In addition to the dredging permit, you will need to obtain a permit from US Army Corps of Engineers - please contact Mr. Mike O'Keefe of the Corps of Engineers at (715) 345-7911 extension 2. You will also need a WPDES permit from the DNR – please contact Susan Watson at (715) 365-8945.

Please submit the requested information to me as soon as possible because we cannot proceed with processing your application until it is determined to be complete. Please be sure to note any additions or alterations to the project that are different from the original permit application. This is also an opportunity for you to explain how your project will avoid impacts to public rights including, but not limited to, all types of water navigation and recreation, fish and wildlife populations, natural scenic beauty and water quality.

If I do not hear from you or receive the additional information identified in the attached checklists within 30 days, I will assume you are no longer interested in the project and will dismiss your application. By law, your fee will not be refunded unless you request it.

Please note that once your permit application is determined to be complete, the Department cannot refund your permit fee. We will review your proposal and issue a permit decision, unless you request in writing that your permit application be withdrawn.

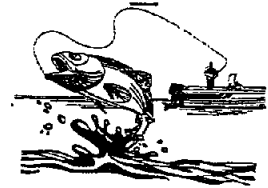

Dear Mr. Grafelman:

I am the original drafter of the Petition to allow for us to dredge out a small area on Pine Lake and have been provided a copy of your February 3rd letter to Karl Tauer. I am sorry that I did not get a chance to respond to you earlier but I have been out of the state. After reviewing your letter, it has been determined that it would be in the best interest of Pine Lake at this time to withdraw its application to allow for dredging. Accordingly, I would request that you return the application and the check to the undersigned.

However, I cannot leave this issue go without making some comments. Pine Lake has become a lot more active over the last 10 years in trying to improve the quality of the lake. We have applied for and received a grant to buy a weed harvester and a transporter. We then appropriated money to house this equipment and increase the taxes to fund a building and buy property on the lake. We have now discovered that the water level of the lake during the summer drops off to such a degree that we are having trouble getting our equipment into shore to put the weeds on the conveyor to be hauled away. The level of the lake is controlled by three dams on the south end; two of which are controlled by the DNR. Pine Lake is very shallow and has a high concentration of weeds during the later summer months. Additionally, we have just been advised that we have a hybrid exotic species of weeds that the DNR wants us to monitor. Having said all this, I wish that you and your office would have been somewhat more cooperative with us in getting the dredging permit. In reading your letter, it appears that we have to put in a thousand hours of application time to scoop out of couple of handfuls of lake sediment. This is very frustrating to me and the other commissioners. Therefore, I request that you withdraw the application and we will proceed to review our options regarding this matter.

Re: Dredging Application

Pat,

We've received the paperwork for the withdrawal of dredging paperwork for Pine Lake. Since that time, your letter arrived to the DNR and the "Jobs Bill" was signed. I've copied the handout received from Dale Lang at our last Zoning Administrator's meeting. These rules will apply to lake and river designations that were instituted in 2002 called *The State of the Basin Report*. In this report you will find Pine Lake designated as an impaired water.

This past year, the sanitary program was tightened in Forest County. We now have three ways to force an inspection, at time of sale, at time of improvement and by signed complaint. We check the Register of Deeds office every Friday for sales and have been ordering inspections on a large number of properties. Pine Lake is one of our targets. I'm not sure there will be any more money for the DNR sanitary inspection program because there is no legal basis for it, so we have the best program going for this aspect of lake clean up.

I've read the report of you application, and I think I can help. When you have time in Town, stop in the office and we can discuss some of the things that need to be done for the application. If you are going to apply for a permit, lets make it an ongoing project. Pine Lake is getting old and it needs dredging to maintain itself. It is unfortunate that people don't understand the value of sediment removal and look at projects like this as environmental sacrilege.

In other news, FCAL asked the Potowatomis to help with zoning issues. I'm not sure why. Looking toward the future and Smart Growth?
